

How Do I Cope With The Rising Cost of Living?

Constantly in the news, the country's inflation rate stubbornly remains around the 8-10% mark.

Hard-earned wages and/or benefits are being stretched to the limit; rents and mortgages, energy bills and food prices will not stop going up! Unfortunately, this may be the situation for the rest of the year. According to the independent reviews organisation for housing developments, *HomeViews*, there are various elements that are contributing to the current high cost of living and that this is more keenly felt in London than anywhere else in the UK.

The government has recently published up to date cost of living insights, looking at changes in prices on everyday items, and much more. The government also recently published several money-saving tips on its Help for Households feature which can be seen on our website.






International Women's Day

What's Been Happening At SW9?



We are proud that the activities we have been able to offer have been so well received. Upon building on our RISE programme, we have been able to engage with over 2.500 residents.

An exciting piece of news has been the development of the JESSUP (Joint Estate and Street Properties Sisters Uniting People) Committee Group who are enthusiastic in engaging with our community to tackle isolation, deprivation, and discrimination. We featured JESSUP on the previous page.

This year, we have introduced Individual block meetings, where residents are able to speak about issues that directly affect their home. Our training opportunities include hands-on truck driving, online training courses on various subjects and electrician courses. If you wish to partake in a course that we do not offer, apply for the SW9 Employment and Training Grant, which you could use towards payment of your chosen course.

War on Graffiti

23rd June was just an ordinary sunny Friday in June, but it also marked the time where, to the best of our knowledge, there was zero graffiti across the estate at SW9.


We've recently seen an increase in graffiti at Stockwell Park, and we are aware just how much you dislike it. The increase seems to be in opportunist 'tagging' – where often indecipherable initials or words are repeated in as many different places as possible.

This is to confirm that SW9 Community Housing will take a 'zero tolerance' approach to graffiti and aim to clear if off in 7 days at the very longest. Any graffiti that is racist, homophobic or otherwise offensive will be cleaned off within 4 hours. If you think that we have missed any graffiti, please contact us about it in the usual way. We're going to log areas of frequent

abuse, and see if we can make any physical improvements, like anti-graffiti treatments and re-sited CCTV which will deter the perpetrators.

There is a real difference from graffiti that vandalises your homes and the street art which is showcased at the Hall of Fame. Some of the work there is fantastic, and our own art gallery in the centre of SW9.





Regeneration

On Friday 2nd June 2023 Construction
Management Contractors Claritas announced that
they were filing for Creditors Voluntary Liquidation
due to cashflow and inflationary pressures.
Network Homes have successfully secured a
new Construction Management Contractor called
Stack London Ltd who have expertise in delivering
residential and mixed-use developments.

Network aims to handover both Aytoun Road and Crowhurst Lift by Mid October 2023.
