The London Mayor and London
Assembly elections are upon us. If you are registered to vote on Thursday 2
May, please remember that you will need to take an accepted form of photo identification to the polling station.

According to the UK Electorial Commission, accepted forms include:

- a full or provisional UK or Northern Ireland photocard driving licence
- a UK passport
- a Blue Badge
- an Older Person's Bus Pass
- a Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- a Voter Authority Certificate, and more.

The Block Inspections schedule for May is now available to view online.


Each month, Estate Services officers conduct block inspections and residents are welcome to join to help point out local issues and raise any potential problem that may affect your home and surrounding area.

ARE YOU STRUGGLING TO COPE WITH YOUR PET?



We recently had to report on a sad incident when colleagues discovered three very small kittens - named Onyx, Angel and Ebony - dumped in the Chute House bins. Despite sterling efforts, two of the kittens were too weak to survive their ordeal.

It wasn't just upsetting and extremely sad, but it was cruel and unacceptable that the three small creatures were treated this way. We can only imagine how their mother would have been very distressed, also.

If you cannot cope with your small animal, or you see an animal in distress, please call us on 020 7326 3700, or visit us in reception. Please don't resort to dumping the animal.

There are a number of charities and other organisations that can offer advice on how to care for your pet, or can rescue if necessary, including the RSPCA and the Blue Cross Animal Rescue. Some services can neuter your animal for free; a beneficial procedure for your pet, for you and your home.

We hope that what happened to Onyx, Angel and Ebony won't happen again.
